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MARKET UPDATE **QUARTER 2, 2018**

Equity prices vacillated during the quarter while the world's two largest economies continued to feud over trade and tariffs. Some are concerned that matters will continue to escalate into a growth-hindering trade war, while others expect the U.S. and China to ultimately reach a logical compromise. By quarter-end equity prices ended mostly higher and were about where they were in January.

Domestically, large company stocks (S&P 500) and small company stocks (Russell 2000) increased 3.43% and 7.75% respectively. The strongest performing sectors within the S&P 500 index were energy and consumer discretionary, which increased 13.5% and 8.2%. Industrials and financials were the weakest performing sectors, falling 3.2% each over the quarter¹.

The U.S. dollar appreciated considerably during the second quarter, decreasing returns for investors investing in foreign markets. A decrease in value of the U.S. dollar enhances foreign securities returns to U.S. investors while an increase in the dollar's value reduces them. For the quarter, the MSCI EAFE Index (in U.S. Dollars) decreased 1.24% while the MSCI EAFE Index (in Local Currency) increased 3.47%¹.

Fixed income yields increased during the second quarter as bond prices fell. Yields on 10-year Treasury notes increased from 2.73% at the beginning of the quarter to 2.85% by the quarter-end³. For the quarter, the Barclays U.S. Aggregate bond index (a blended bond composite) declined 0.16%¹.

On June 13, the Federal Reserve's Open Market Committee increased the interbank lending rate target (federal funds rate) to 1.75% - 2%. In the official statement following the meeting, the Fed reiterated that it "seeks to foster maximum employment and price stability."

As part of this mandate the Committee continually monitors economic activity, labor market conditions and how close inflation is to their preferred 2% target. The market's consensus is that the Fed will raise rates two more times this year and an additional three times in 2019, but for the first time since 2012 core inflation has reached 2% which could lead the Fed to moving faster than consensus estimates².

Long term, we continue to believe that well diversified global stock and bond portfolios, and disciplined investment strategies can continue to provide opportunities for those investors looking for growth.
